A revocable trust provides a confidential way to manage your assets during incapacity and to transfer assets at death. A revocable trust may help with management of your tax burden so that you can leave the maximum amount of your assets to your beneficiaries. A revocable trust becomes irrevocable upon your death and all of the assets in the trust are not subject to the probate process. There are many different types of trust. For example, you can establish a charitable trust, business trust, cabin trust, or a special needs trust for a disabled child to name just a few.
